Our tips for helping your child to enjoy reading



Look for books your child is interested in e.g. dragons, insects, trains, sport

Encourage your child to pretend to "read" a book before they can read words


Make time every day for reading

Talk about pictures, photographs, words books and stories

Visit your library as often as possible

If English is not your first language ask for dual language books at the library

If your child does not like stories or books encourage them to look at/read magazines, comics, e-texts, picture cards, jigsaw puzzles, shop signs, road signs, food packets, shopping lists, catalogues, menus
